### Artist statement

Stars have forever whispered to humanity from the vast canvas of the night sky. They are quiet yet radiant, glorifying the heavens and igniting dreams in our hearts. For centuries, they have symbolized guidance, wonder, and hope—whether illuminating the traveler's path or adorning the narratives of poets and mystics.

This body of work draws from a deeply personal yet universally resonant inspiration: the star imprinted on Pakistan's official affidavit paper. A small yet significant mark that carries layers of identity, formality, and trust—often overlooked but inherently powerful. In its simplicity lies a profound symbolism: stars are witnesses to our promises, anchors of accountability, and silent companions through life's many journeys.

Beyond bureaucracy, stars have transcended time and culture. They guide the night sky, appear on the flags of nations as emblems of unity, and stand as symbols of achievement and excellence—whether in the celestial realm or on school report cards. In religion, art, and design, they remain timeless icons of spirituality and beauty, reflecting our connection to something far greater than ourselves.

This work reimagines the star not just as a celestial body but as a symbol of light and transformation. Drawing from the rich heritage of the region, the works explore the quiet power of stars—how they watch over our celebrations, solemn moments, and unspoken vows. Whether embedded in the sky, on paper, or in our imagination, these stars become silent witnesses to our lives, holding within them the weight of stories both personal and shared.

#### Profile

Bushra Waqas Khan (b. 1986) graduated summa cum laude from the National College of Arts, Lahore (2008) with a Bachelor's Degree in Fine Arts, specialising in Printmaking. In her current practice, Khan reimagines the intricate designs of a state document better known as an Affidavit or Oath Paper. These papers, often associated with legal ownership and rights, particularly of men, symbolize systemic exclusion and the perpetuation of patriarchal norms. By manipulating and strategically repeating these patterns, she creates visually elaborate and conceptually charged works.

Khan's practice is multidisciplinary, encompassing both 2D and 3D forms. Her work ranges from intricate paper-based compositions to sculptural installations and meticulously crafted textile pieces. These creations highlight the interplay between printmaking techniques and the materiality of textiles, merging the traditional and the contemporary. Through this approach, she critiques the lingering impact of colonization in South Asia, exploring themes of identity, power, and societal fragmentation.

By pushing the boundaries of form and medium, Khan transforms symbols of state control into powerful expressions of resistance, creating a dialogue that challenges historical and cultural hierarchies.
