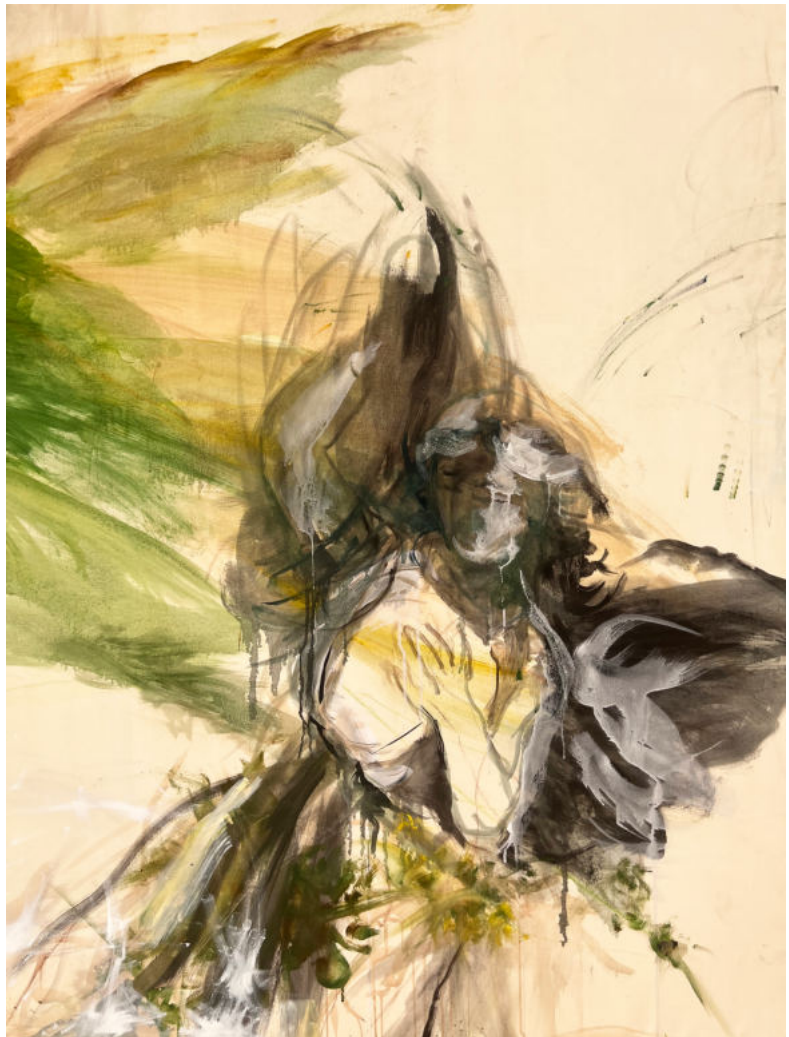
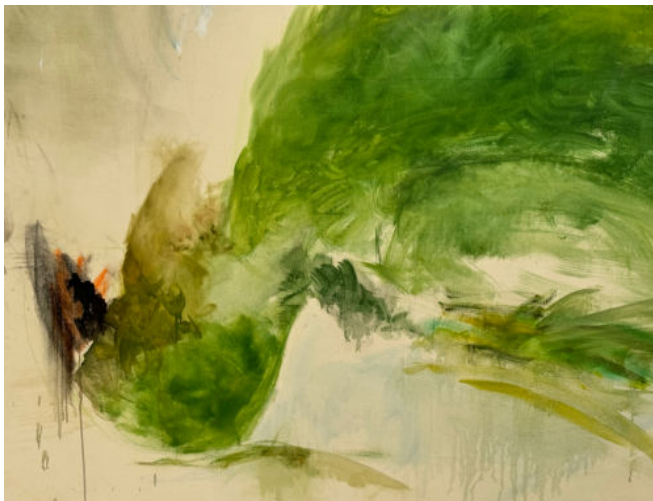

Artist statement

An Ode to Empty Bottles delves into the pervasive internal emptiness of the human condition. I perceive this as reflecting life's chaotic outside and exhibitory nature. This provokes me to seek – the incomprehensible, the transient, and the elusive, which I try to execute theatrically. I painted with my hands and with loose brushstrokes on a large scale. By incorporating found objects – old, damaged, discarded glassware and empty bottles- I transform these into symbolic chandeliers, bridging notions of grandeur and decay. The work process gave me the freedom to embrace spontaneity and fearlessness. It's a breaking away from the constraints of often in-demand subjects in contemporary art from colonized countries. My work challenges these expectations with a sense of irreverence and subtle sarcasm, reflected in the Informality of the titles and gestures within the pieces.

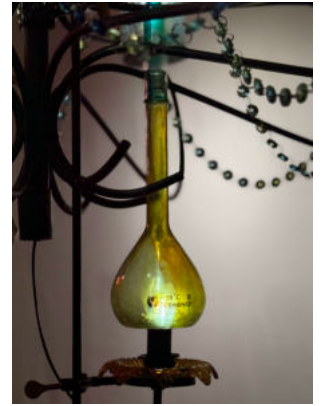
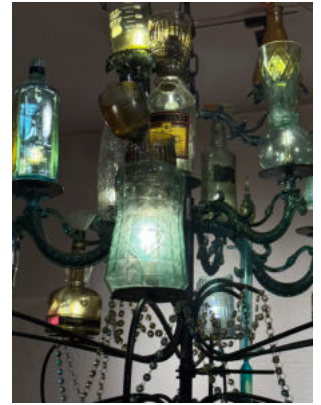

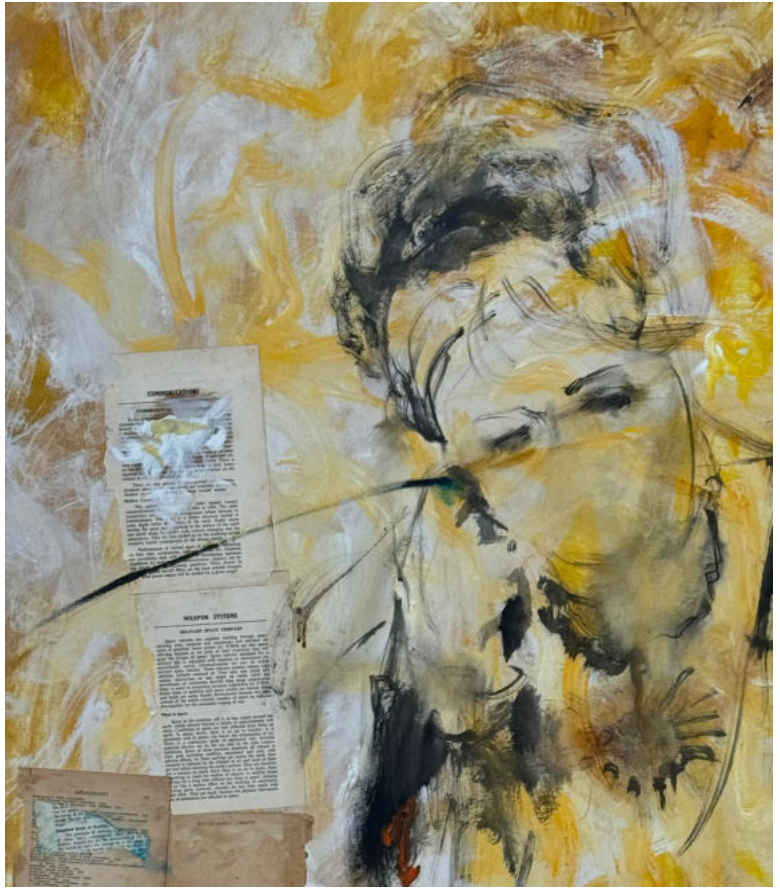

Profile

Masooma Syed is a Pakistani visual artist whose life and art practice have been profoundly shaped by years of living and working across South Asia. This unique experience has significantly influenced her studio practice, teaching art and her understanding of the world. Her work has been exhibited internationally, including at the Fukuoka Asian Art Triennial (Japan), Lahore Art Biennale (Pakistan), Harris Museum, Blackburn (England), Metropolitan Museum Tokyo (Japan), Apex Art (New York, USA), Kunsthalle Fridericianum (Kassel, Germany), Kiran Nadar Museum of Art (Delhi, India), Devi Art Foundation (New Delhi, India), and NGMA, Mumbai (India). She has also shown with prominent galleries such as Canvas Gallery, Karachi, Rohtas Art Gallery, Lahore, PNCA Islamabad, Gallery Ske (Delhi/Bangalore, India), Vadehra Art Gallery, Delhi, Red Dot (Colombo, Sri Lanka), and Art Dubai. Her teaching has spanned renowned institutions including the National College of Arts, Beaconhouse National University, and Indus Valley School in Pakistan, as well as School of Culture and Creative Expressions, Ambedkar University (Delhi, India), Kathmandu University (Nepal), Theertha School of Art (Colombo, Sri Lanka), and Swami Vipula Anand School of Aesthetic (Batticaloa, Sri Lanka). Masooma Syed has received numerous accolades, including the Commonwealth Fellowship of Art and Craft, the 'HAT' Here and There, Art and Craft fellowship, and a Research Fellowship at Kelaniya University (Sri Lanka). She has participated in residencies at Khoj (Delhi, India), Vasl (Karachi, Pakistan), Theertha (Colombo, Sri Lanka), Guild Art Gallery (New York, USA), and the Puducherry Blue – SAARC International Artists Camp (Puducherry, India).
