
Profile

Hooria Khan, a visual artist born in Rahim Yar Khan in 1996, established her artistic career in Lahore. Graduating with distinction from the National College of Arts in Lahore in 2021, Hooria has specialised in Miniature Painting, complemented by minors in taxidermy, calligraphy, and photography. Throughout her academic journey, Hooria garnered consecutive merit awards at NCA. Hooria's artistic endeavours extend beyond academia, as she has actively participated in numerous exhibitions and collaborative projects, including the Maktab project under the guidance of internationally acclaimed artist Imran Qureshi, and Pakistan's pavilion at Dubai Expo 2020 with renowned artist Akif Suri. Hooria has showcased her artwork in multiple group exhibitions, including Broadcast II and Dar Amad at O art Space Lahore, The New Odyssey at PNCA Islamabad, Eternal Ephemeral at Full Circle Gallery Karachi, Before the End of Time at Canvas Gallery, A Voyage at Satrang Gallery, Islamabad, FireFly Dreams at Muse Art Gallery Lahore, Liminal Spaces at Dastaangoi Gallery Islamabad, free will at Numaish Gah, and A line that divides at Canvas Gallery. Central to Hooria's artistic vision is a profound exploration of ritualistic stereotypes entrenched within society. Her body of work intricately weaves together organic and inorganic elements, casting light on the subtleties and contradictions often overlooked in our everyday lives. Through her art, Hooria aims to challenge perceptions and provoke introspection, inviting viewers to reconsider the complexities of their surroundings.


Artist statement

My artistic journey is a tapestry woven with threads of growth, survival, and defiance - At the heart of my practice, I use unconventional materials like fungus grown through flowers and handmade paper enriched with found materials, a tangible link to the land I belong, a symbiotic relationship between nature and nurture. The process mirrors the inherent need for adaptation and involvement in order to thrive - a reflection of the resilience ingrained within the very fabric of existence.

In my practice, I portray figures that transcend gender, evoking the enigmatic allure of demonic entities from miniature paintings. These figures, imbued with symbolism of power, fear, and threat, serve as potent reminders of the oppressors that seek to control and intimidate. Similarly, animals take on a metaphorical guise as suppressed human beings - beings stifled and constrained by the pervasive presence of power and authority. Through these depictions, I explore the intricate dialogue between individuals and their environments, shedding light on the ways in which societal norms and power dynamics shape our growth and autonomy.





MAISAM HUSSAIN

Profile

Born in 1997 in the village of Zoor Kali, Parachinar, I am a visual artist, sculptor, and art educator from the rugged terrain of Zeran in northern Pakistan. My work focuses on using gunpowder and exploring different surfaces with raw materials commonly found in weaponry. Growing up in a war-affected region, my artistic journey has been deeply influenced by the challenges and experiences of my upbringing. The echoes of war have served as both a haunting muse and an indomitable source of inspiration. My introduction to the world of craftsmanship came at a very young age, thanks to my father, Naseeb Ali. His unwavering support and instrumental role in nurturing a school of thought have been crucial to my artistic evolution. I completed my primary education in Zeran and graduated with distinction in Sculpture from the National College of Arts, Lahore, in 2021.

Currently, I am serving as an art educator and a lead instructor, teaching the foundation year (sculpture) at the National College of Arts Lahore. Additionally, I have recently joined Alhamra Art Center as a sculpture studio teacher and instructor.

Artist statement

I believe our lives are shaped by the memories we carry and the everyday experiences that surround us. What we feel, see, or do becomes an integral part of who we are. My work as an artist is deeply influenced by the hardships and stark realities of Parachinar, my hometown. Growing up in a place marred by war, I became accustomed to the disturbing sounds of explosions that left scars on both buildings and people. Dust-filled air and moments of shock, lying on the ground, became familiar scenes of my childhood. The marks of bullets and bombings still linger on the victims and the places they struck, leaving an indelible impact on my growth and perspective. These bomb blasts, once terrifying, have now become a part of me. The scars on the buildings are not just physical marks but symbols of the times that stayed with me for a long time. They are reminders of the challenges and struggles we face as a community. In my artistic expression, I strive to give the memories a visual forms, embedded in my mind.

I use various materials like paper mesh cast, metal, and gunpowder on paper to convey the emotions and stories embedded in my experiences. Each piece is a reminder of the resilience and strength of the people and places that have endured the harsh realities of war. Through my art, I aim to share a piece of my world and evoke a connection to the collective memory of my community.

I created this piece to honor the faces and portraits of those martyred in the recent attack on a convoy traveling between Peshawar and Parachinar. The convoy, carrying hundreds of people—including elders, women, children, patients, and travelers—as well as food and medicine, was brutally ambushed.

In this horrifying attack, innocent people were killed in the most inhumane way, with some being beheaded. The attackers even shared footage of their barbaric actions, adding to the pain and grief.

After every such tragedy, lists of the martyrs are posted in city shops and public places as a tribute to their sacrifice. Every year, we also observe Martyrs' Day, displaying thousands of portraits across the city to remember and honor their courage and service in defending the motherland.


I created this piece based on the tragic events that unfolded on the main road connecting Parachinar with Peshawar, where a convoy was brutally attacked.

These abstract yet deeply painful visuals capture the faces and portraits of the people of Bagan City— elders, babies, women, patients, travelers—who were simply making their journey, carrying food and medicine.

On that road, the attackers opened fire on the vehicles with machine guns and rocket launchers. They looted luggage, stole supplies, and committed unspeakable atrocities — beheading victims with knives, setting cars on fire, and taking away food and medicine meant for those in need.

Profile



Artist statement





Profile

Vania Mazhar (b. 2001, Pakistan) is a Lahore-based visual artist who graduated with a BFA in Painting from the National College of Arts. Mazhar's work revolves around capturing and analyzing the mundane moments often overlooked in everyday life, family archives, and the idea of home. Using a variety of mediums—drawing, video art, and projections—her creative process involves observation, documentation, and painting in both studios and digitally on screens.


Mazhar's work has been showcased in prominent galleries and museums, including the COMO Museum of Art, Khaas Contemporary, VASL Artists' Association, Lahore Digital Festival (LDF), and Zahoor ul Akhlaq Gallery. She has also participated in the Our Shared Cultural Heritage (OSCH): Crafting Histories project, which took her work to both Lahore and Glasgow. Mazhar is currently part of the curatorial team at the Zahoor ul Akhlaq Gallery and teaches drawing at the National College of Arts.

Artist statement

I am a painter who draws. Working across drawing, photography, video, and projection mapping to capture and explore the world around me, my practice is shaped by my grandfather, who filmed hours of family moments, instilling in me a compulsive drive to document my surroundings through various mediums.

I focus on the human figure to create intimate narratives, often depicting domestic scenes such as my family during quiet moments at home. I explore the significance of these mundane tasks and their connection to memory. Over time, my work has expanded to include the new cities I visit and the stories I encounter through my curatorial practice, reflecting a growing interest in migration and cross-cultural experiences.

My work blends traditional mark-making with digital techniques, creating layers of texture and opacity. This experience deepened my desire to document everyday life and explore how drawing with paint can evolve across different contexts.




