MISHA JAPANWALA



Profile

Misha Japanwala (b. 1995) is a Pakistani artist and fashion designer, whose work is rooted in the rejection and deconstruction of shame attached to one's body, and discussion of themes such as bodily autonomy, gender based violence, moral policing, sexuality and censorship.

Speaking to the objectification, commodification and control exerted on marginalized bodies by societies and systems enveloped in patriarchy, Misha's work aims to create a new historical record and documentation of people — one that is on our own terms, and rooted in honesty, resistance and hope.

Through molding the body to create casts that are worn as sculptural garments, Misha's artistic practice blurs the lines between fashion and fine art, clothing and nudity, and asks viewers to see the body exactly as it is. Her practice is an insistence for bodies to occupy physical space, emphasizing the notion that our bodies shouldn't need to prove anything other than being allowed to simply exist.

Misha's calligraphic work takes the form of silhouettes of the body intertwined with Urdu script - often in an effort to reclaim words and ideas that are used as weapons of shame and control.

Misha has exhibited work in Pakistan and the US. Her work is part of the permanent collection at The Tang Museum as well as numerous private collections around the world. Her work has been photographed for and written about in various international publications including The New York Times, Vogue, The Guardian, The Washington Post and Document Journal. Misha's pieces have been worn by people such as Cardi B, Lupita Nyong'o, Lil Nas X and Joy Crookes. She was an honoree on the Forbes Under 30 list in 2021, and on the Dazed 100 list in 2024.

Misha was raised in Karachi, Pakistan. She received a BFA in Fashion Design from Parsons School of Design in 2014, and is currently based between Karachi and New Jersey, where she lives with her husband, and puppy Snug The Joiner.

Her work continues to be an explorative, radical and shameless celebration of people and their bodies.

Artist statement

Bodies reimagined as landscapes: dynamic and shifting natural formations. These new works are a continuation of my series 'Topographies', in which bodies are cast and abstracted - embracing lumps, rolls, folds and crevices as celebrations of form, texture and colour.

Drenched in bright, saturated colours, these works command attention to parts of the body that are usually shamed, smoothed over and suffocated. They offer a vision of ourselves that is joyful, leisurely and playful. I named the sculptures in this series after geological formations - while variations of our our bodies are often described in terms that criticize and scrutinize, land formations are neutral in their difference, and often praised for the great diversity of the earth. In thinking of the land and body as one, I ask us to rethink our relationship to bodily topographies, and to consider them with the same care and wonder as we do topographies on land.







Profile

Zahrah Ehsan (c.1988) is a Pakistani visual artist, filmmaker, curator, and art educator.

In 2020, she completed her Master of Arts in Visual Cultures and Curating in Contemporary Arts from Aalto University, Finland. Following her graduation, she participated in the Academy of Moving People and Images in Helsinki, completing a filmmaking program from 2021 to 2022.

National College of Arts, Pakistan. She has designed and taught studio and theory-based courses, including painting, drawing, and fine art seminars at NCA for four years. Her practice is deeply experimental including scavenged materials from industry, popular culture, and utility; incorporating it into her paintings, moving images/video-art and on-site installations - mostly critiquing on the notions of gender, identity, mental health, and everyday labour.

She earned her Bachelor's of Fine Arts with Honours in 2012, with a concentration in painting at the


She currently lives and works in Dallas, USA.

Artist statement

unchanging constant amidst the ever-changing backdrop of countries and cultures-like in Finland, Pakistan, and now the United States-becomes the vessel through which I convey the autobiographical motifs that resonate deeply within me. These motifs touch on unresolved concerns of gender, adaptation, identity, and mental health. In Body as Home, my physical form transcends its tangible presence, becoming both a symbol of the self and a home I carry within me.

These paintings and drawings stem from the series called Body as Home, a metaphorical concept that places my physical self at the epicenter of my artistic practice. The body, an

Rooted in the tension between movement and stillness, the works in oil painting and drawings on paper invite the viewer to explore how presence lingers, how space holds memory, and how the self guietly shifts within it all.




Title: 9.8.2022 at 14.05, Espoo - Finland (I)


Title: 9.8.2022 at 14.05, Espoo - Finland (II)








Title: Fitting Room - December 3, 2023 Gulberg, Pakistan


